Level 2 Certificate in Fundamental Inspection, Testing & Initial Verification City & Guilds 2392-10

Course Duration	4 Days 8:15 to 16.45 Additional attendance will be required for a closed book 1½ hour on-line examination and a practical assessment, by arrangement with the Centre.
Course Objectives	The course will provide knowledge and practice on the requirements for inspection and testing initial verification of electrical circuits. It is designed to prepare candidates for achievement of a Level 2 qualification, and if required, to prepare them to progress to the full Level 3 Inspection, Testing and Certification qualification C & G 2392-20.
Course Content	Content to follow the C & G 2392-10 syllabus to include:- General requirements Initial verification Inspection and testing Test instruments Practical inspection assessment to demonstrate the ability to identify departures and compliance with BS7671 for completion of initial Inspection and Testing Certification as detailed in Guidance Note 3.
Who should attend?	All electrical practitioners, contractors and allied trades working to building regulations who are required to meet initial verification of electrical circuits and require the principles of Inspection & Testing for compliance with BS7671. It is not mandatory to hold the current C & G 2382-10 IET Wiring Regulations BS7671 17 th Edition, but it is strongly recommended.
